

Labor Day: Sept. 4 School & Offices Closed

### Rosh Hashanah: Sept. 15-17



The first of the Jewish High Holy Days; a two-day celebration of the Jewish New Year; commemorates the anniversary of the creation of Adam and Eve; traditions include attending synagogue, eating symbolic foods, and sounding the shofar (a ram's horn). **Greeting:** "Shanah Tovah" (Hebrew)



### Yom Kippur: Sept. 24-25

School & Offices Closed Sept. 25 The Day of Atonement, which focuses on repentance; the holiest day in Judaism marked by a 25-hour period of fasting and intensive prayer, with most of the day often spent in synagogue prayer services. **Greeting:** "Good Yuntif" or "Yom Tov" (Hebrew)



Indigenous Peoples Day & Columbus Day: Oct. 9 School & Offices Closed



Veterans Day: Nov. 11 School & Offices Closed Nov. 10

### Diwali: Nov. 12



The festival of lights, celebrated by Hindus, Jains, and Sikhs, symbolizes the spiritual victory of light over darkness; celebrants light diyas (oil lamps); Hindus worship godess of prosperty Lakshimi; Sikhs read from their holy scripture Guru Granth Sahib; and Jains recite prayers to honor the liberation of the soul of Lord Mahavir. **Greeting:** "Happy Diwali!" or "Shubh Diwali" (Hindi)

### Hanukkah: Dec. 7-15

Jewish festival of lights; commemorates the rededication of the Second Temple in Jerusalem during the Maccabean Revolt; celebrants light a menorah and exchange gifts. **Greeting:** "Happy Hanukkah!" or "Hanukkah Sameach!" (Hebrew)



### Christmas: Dec. 25
