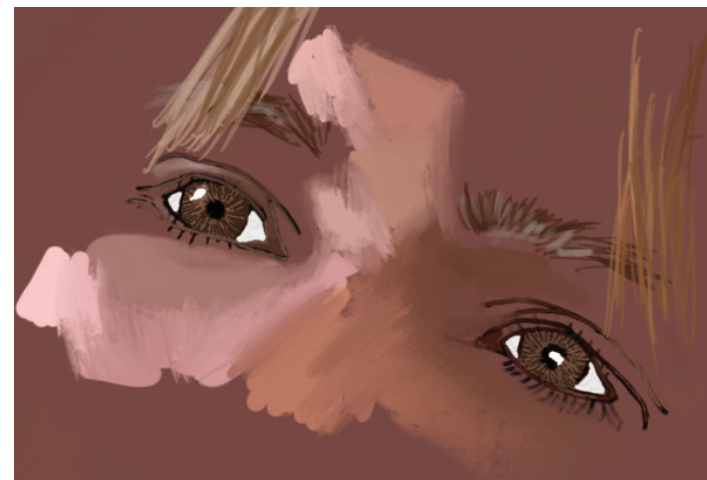

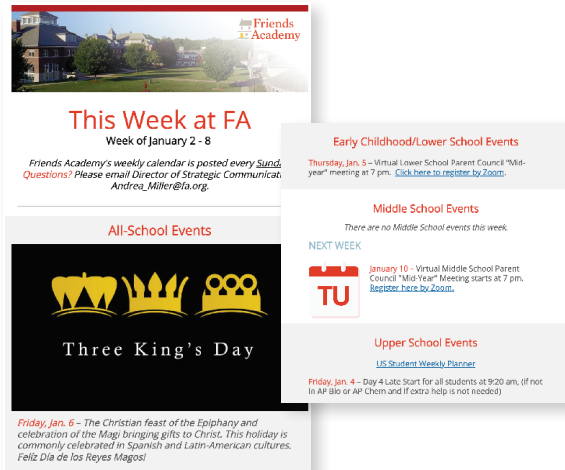

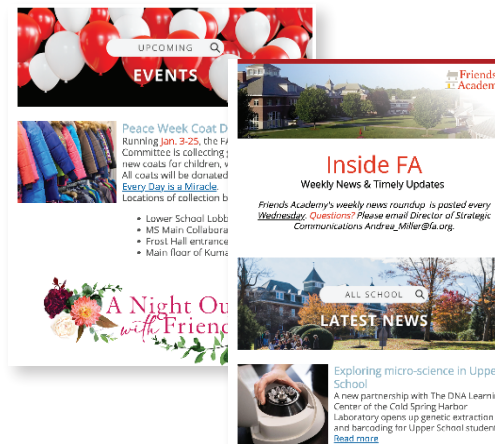

Yom Kippur: Sept. 24-25

The Day of Atonement, which focuses on repentance; the holiest day in Judaism marked by a 25-hour period of fasting and intensive prayer, with most of the day often spent in synagogue prayer services.

Lunar New Year: Feb. 10

Celebrates the first new moon of the lunar calendar; commonly celebrated in China and other Asian countries; traditions include religious ceremonies, exchanging red envelopes, dances, fireworks and a Lantern Festival.

Greeting: "Gong hei fat choy" (Cantonese) or "Gong xi fa cai" (Mandarin)

The ninth month of the Islamic calendar commemorating Muhammad's first revelation; begins during a crescent moon; traditions include fasting each day from sunrise to sunset, acts of charity, prayer, and reflection. **Greeting:** "Happy Ramadan" or "Ramadan Mubarak" (Arabic)

Naw Ruz: March 19

The Iranian or Persian New Year; celebrates the vernal equinox; traditions include purchasing new clothes and flowers, visiting family and friends, and celebrating the equinox at the Haft-sin table. **Greeting:** "Happy Nowruz" or "Nowruz Mubarak" (Persian)

Palm Sunday: March 24

Christian feast commemorating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem a week before his resurrection; first day of Holy Week, the final week of Lent; traditions include the blessing and distribution of palm branches. **Greeting:** "Happy Palm Sunday!"

Easter: March 31

School Closed March 29-April 1

Christian holiday commemorating Jesus' resurrection from the dead and the end of Lent; traditions include religious services, decorating Easter eggs, and feasts with family. **Greeting:** "Happy Easter"

Eid al-Fitr: Sundown of April 9, ending April 10

School Closed April 10

Muslim "Festival of Breaking the Fast" that marks the end of Ramadan; marked by the sight of a crescent moon; traditions include the Eid prayer, acts of charity, gift-giving, gatherings, and festive meals. **Greeting:** "Eid Mubarak" (Arabic)

Passover: April 22-30

Jewish holiday that marks the Exodus of the Children of Israel from Egyptian slavery; celebrated with a seder, which combines religious rituals, food, song, and storytelling. **Greeting:** "Happy Passover" or "Chag Pesach Sameach" (Hebrew)


